In December there was a Christmas celebration dinner at the TEAMS home office to honor our Medipack volunteers. Each week they prepare the medicines that are needed for Jamaica under my direction. Tablets are carefully counted and placed in small bags with a label so that they are ready to be dispensed at our clinics. The amount of time saved is incredible. It would be impossible to fill over 1500 prescriptions in one week without the medicines being prepared ahead of time. I am amazed at their loyalty and the selfless gift of their time. The ladies are my personal cheerleaders! It means so much knowing that they are praying for me and our ministry. Every time I go to Jamaica a part of them goes with me.

A wide variety of medicines and supplies are donated to us. It is our desire to be good stewards of these items. Medicines that we can not use in Jamaica are donated to a free church clinic here in Allentown. This summer we received 22 cases of scrubs from a company in Texas. At first we were overwhelmed by what to do with such a large donation. We promptly got busy sorting the uniforms. We took many of them to Jamaica for national doctors and nurses. Scrubs there are extremely costly and hospitals have a shortage of them. Many workers like Nadine Gordon have benefited from these. The remaining scrubs were shipped to an orphanage in Africa. There the workers desperately needed clean uniforms to help prevent spreading contagious diseases.
